Dear Mr. John D. Tinkham,

I am writing in regard to your recent request to enter a compliance agreement with the Maine Forest Service allowing for the importation of heat-treated hardwood firewood sourced from Colton Enterprises, Inc. in Pittsfield, VT into Maine.

The Maine Forest Service has adopted USDA heat treatment standards T314-c designed to destroy various wood pests potentially found in regulated wood articles such as hardwood firewood, meaning heat-treated hardwood firewood must be subjected to a minimum core temperature of 71.1 °C (160.0 °F) for a duration of 75 minutes to be considered safe for import into Maine. Once this firewood has been heat-treated to USDA T314-c standards, it is no longer considered a regulated article, and therefore no longer requires a compliance agreement with the Maine Forest Service to enter Maine.

I have verified that heat-treated hardwood firewood produced by Colton Enterprises, Inc. meets USDA T314-c heat treatment standards. I have also verified that the kiln used by Colton Enterprises, Inc. to perform heat-treatment is certified by the Vermont Agency of Agriculture. The Maine Forest Service is therefore satisfied that heat-treated hardwood firewood sourced from Colton Enterprises, Inc. no longer poses a significant threat for the introduction of forest pests and can be imported into Maine without additional restrictions.

Although no compliance agreement with the Maine Forest Service is required in this instance, all heat-treated hardwood firewood entering Maine must still be accompanied by a certificate documenting heat-treatment. A copy of this certificate can be obtained from Colton Enterprises, Inc. to be used as documentation for heat-treated hardwood firewood sales by The Firewood Guy to Maine customers. Please feel free to use this letter as supplemental documentation that the Maine Forest Service recognizes the import of heat-treated hardwood firewood sourced from Colton Enterprises, Inc. by The Firewood Guy into Maine as an acceptable practice.

Signed New York Standards for firewood treatment and labeling:

- (1) Firewood may be labeled "New York Approved Treated Firewood/Pest Free" if accompanied by a firewood producer's certification that it was heat treated to achieve a minimum core temperature of 71° C (160 ° F) for a minimum of 75 minutes. Such treatment may employ kiln-drying or other heat treatments approved by the Agency that achieve this specification through use of steam, hot water, dry heat, or other methods.
- (2) A firewood producer's certification shall indicate the producer's name, legal address, and the village, town, or city of the business on a label, bill of sale or lading, purchase receipt or invoice accompanying the firewood.
- (3) Producers of "New York (or other applicable State) Approved Treated Firewood/Pest Free" firewood shall maintain, for at least one year from the date of treatment, records documenting the treatment method(s) and volume(s) of firewood treated, and shall allow Agency officials to inspect such records and the treatment facilities upon request.
